Faith in Action of McHenry County Graduates New Class of Legacy Corps Members

In April 2011, Faith in Action of McHenry County (FIAMC), a senior service organization located in Crystal Lake, graduated a new class of Legacy Corps members after 20 hours of training. The Legacy Corps is a group of volunteers that are committed to providing 4500 hours of service to FIAMC per year. Legacy Corps members provide an array services to sustain and enhance the quality of life of senior care receivers. These services can include respite care designed to relieve caregivers, friendly visits for seniors living alone and transportation services.

While serving 450 hours per year, these members receive a stipend of \$2,000 to defray expenses and earn a \$1,250 educational award for lifelong learning opportunities.

Faith in Action has partnered with Legacy Corps of Lutheran Social Services of Illinois (LSSI) since 2005. Legacy is one of the first AmeriCorps programs that specifically utilizes the skills, experiences and talents of adults 50 years and older. Approximately 37 Legacy Corps members have served seniors and caregivers in McHenry County through FIAMC.

About FIAMC

FIAMC began on November 1, 1998 with receipt of \$25,000 from the Robert S. Wood Johnson Foundation to establish an Interfaith Volunteer Caregiver Program for the elderly in McHenry

County utilizing guidelines from the national Faith in Action program. FIAMC began under the umbrella of Family Services and became a stand alone not for profit organization in 2000.

In addition to Legacy Corps volunteers, FIAMC currently utilizes approximately 350 volunteers from faith congregations and the community at large to provide services to care recipients, 60 years of age and older, living in their own home, apartment, or with a family member in McHenry County. Such services include friendly home visits and phone calls, shopping and errands, home maintenance and repairs, light yard work, light household chores, respite services and daily assurance calls.
